We, the Ernst Ludwig Ehrlich Studienwerk (ELES), are one of the thirteen scholarship funds supported by the Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF). In line with the ministry's guidelines, we support especially gifted students and doctoral candidates studying at public and state certified private academic institutions in Germany, the European Union, and Switzerland. We support them in their academic development, building on the engagement and personal development of our scholarship holders.

We support Jews of all denominations and stand for diversity in Judaism and an open society. Since our founding in 2009, we have provided support to more than 1200 students and doctoral candidates, creating a space for them to realise their potential and take on new responsibilities.

APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

- ELES supports gifted Jewish students who demonstrate outstanding academic performance and involvement in society and/or the Jewish community.
- ELES supports highly qualified Jewish doctoral candidates, as well as those researching Jewish topics.
- ELES supports Jews of all denominations and secular Jews alike.
- ELES utilises a multi-stage selection process (formal, technical, personal).

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

- In addition to the personal and academic support programme, ELES also financially supports its scholarship recipients.
- Scholarship holders with children can receive a childcare subsidy.
- The level of financial support provided to students is means-tested against parental income.
- The financial support provided to doctoral candidates is independent of parental income.
